Ashridge Woods are on top of the Chiltern plateau and are 2000 acres of ancient woodland on the Herts and Bucks borders. There are historical remains from the Iron Age and the Victorian era. The monument was built in 1832 in historic parkland which was originally a deer park.

Ursula Troostwyk says “I wanted to capture the feeling of autumn in the woods in an abstract way rather than an objective drawing, to express the changes from summer to autumn with flashes of blue sky and markings of texture.”
