

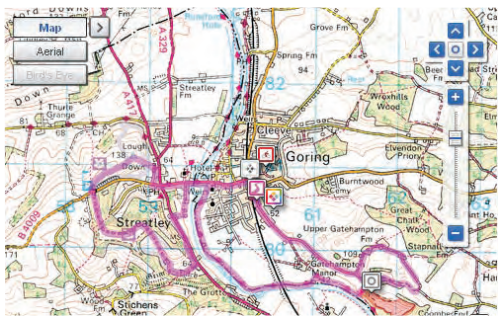

Berkhamsted property wins 2009 Buildings Design Awards



A stylish modern extension to a Victorian house in Berkhamsted has won this year's Chilterns Buildings Design Award. The judges were impressed with the simple range of materials used and the way the extension enhances rather than hides the original building. There were 19 entries in total and two Commended awards were also given out: one for the sensitive addition of a barn to Chisbridge Farm in Frieth and the other for a thoughtful and ingenious refurbishment of The Akeman in Tring to create a bar and restaurant. The awards, which are given jointly with The Chiltern Society, were presented at a ceremony in Shiplake on June 10th.

A new interactive map of walking and cycling routes and countryside sites has gone live on the AONB website. The map is searchable by place or postcode, with an individual search bringing up all routes within a 6km square. The aim is to encourage residents and visitors to make the most of the walking and cycling opportunities close to their home rather than travelling further afield. BBC Countryfile features release of trout into the River Chess



The release of 60 young trout into the River Chess by children from Waterside Combined School in Chesham was shown on BBC1's Countryfile on June 7th. This was the culmination of the Trout in the Classroom Project organised by the Chilterns Chalk Streams Project. A second school, Rickmansworth Park School, has also been looking after trout fry and released 120 young trout into the Chess in April.

A new scheme has been launched to bring together the annual awards offered by the Conservation Board under one umbrella, and it includes two new awards categories :

First State of the Chilterns Environment seminar held

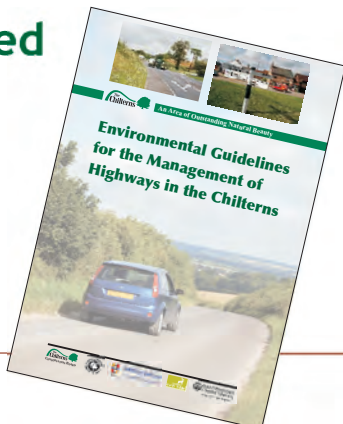
50 people attended the seminar on June 8th to discuss the 22 environmental condition indicators included in the Chilterns AONB Management Plan 2008 - 2013. The event was part of the process of producing the first Report on the State of the Chilterns Environment which will be published in November. The draft report will be circulated this summer.

Board wins silver tourism award



The Conservation Board has been given a Silver award by the Green Tourism Business Scheme, in recognition of all the sustainable practices it has implemented in its operations. These include reducing energy use, producing renewable energy from solar PV panels, minimising waste and planting trees.

New highways guidance published



The updated version of Environmental Guidelines for the Management of Highways in the Chilterns has just been published. It has been adopted by all 4 highway authorities in the Chilterns and contains advice on the most sympathetic and sensitive ways to design and maintain roads in the AONB. It can be downloaded from

News from work areas:

Farming and Land Use



Offley Hoo Farm

- Two surveyors are visiting the 105 one km squares of the Land Use Survey during June and July to record any changes since last year.
- Main findings of the 2008 Land Use Survey are:
 - Nearly 4% increase in cropped arable land since 2006
 - Decrease in uncropped arable land and set-aside
 - More than half of cropped land used for wheat
 - Equestrian use remains steady at 5%

- Over 6,000 people visited 6 Chilterns farms taking part in Open Farm Sunday on June 7th
- Natural England is organising a workshop on ELS and HLS for farmers at Stonor Farm near Henley on June 24th 6.30pm - 8pm. Contact Natural England on 0113 230 3753 for more details.

Access and Recreation

- The 150 mile route of the Chilterns Cycleway has been finalised. CTC and Chiltern Society volunteers are currently researching shorter circular routes from towns along the Cycleway. The Conservation Board and CTC are applying for funding from LEADER for route signing, promotion of the route and Cyclists Welcome training for B & Bs.
- 5000 each of 3 Chilterns Country walks have been re-printed: Beacon View, Ashridge Drovers and Iron Age Fort.

Activities and learning

Planning and Development

- Nearly 400 comments from 34 respondents were received on the draft version of the revised Chilterns Buildings Design Guide. Following further changes the revised Guide will be adopted by the Conservation Board in October.
- Over 20 people attended the Planning Forum on April 28th. Topics discussed included the Board's planning policy guidelines and the impact of the economic climate.

Chalk streams

- 50 people attended the annual Chalk Streams Forum on June 16th in Boxmoor, Hemel Hempstead. The theme was urban river improvement and the presentations were followed by a walk along the River Gade in Hemel looking at the potential for improvements to it as part of the town centre regeneration.

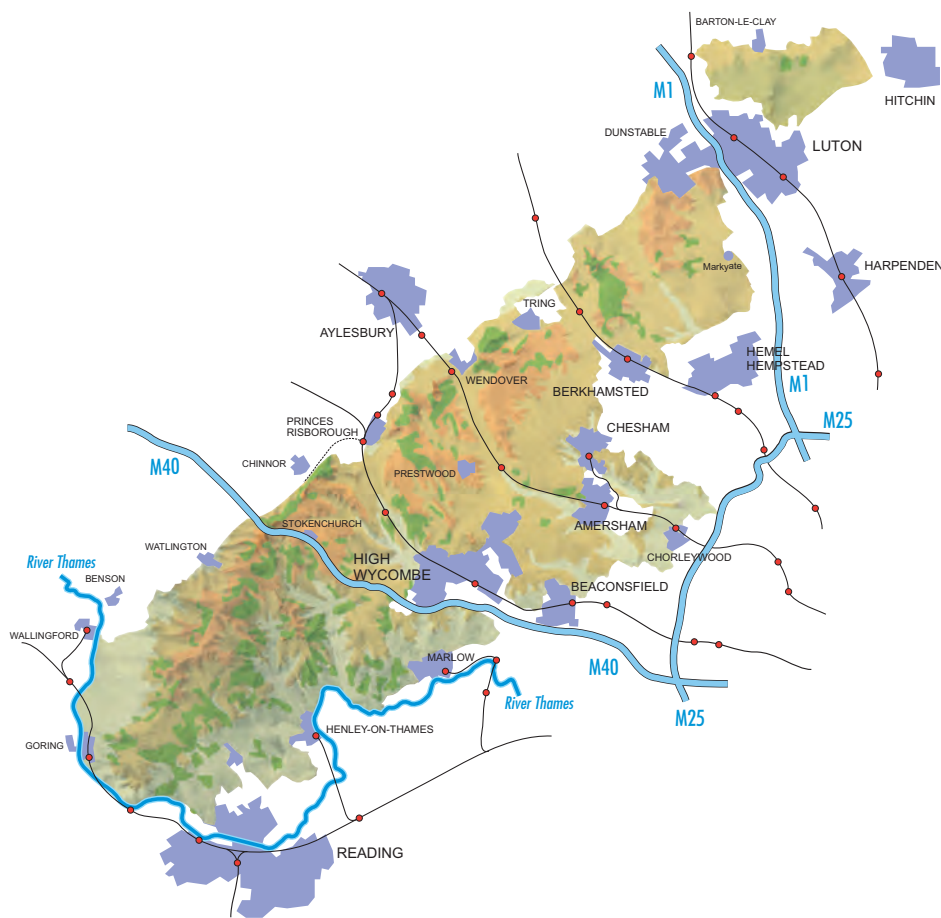
