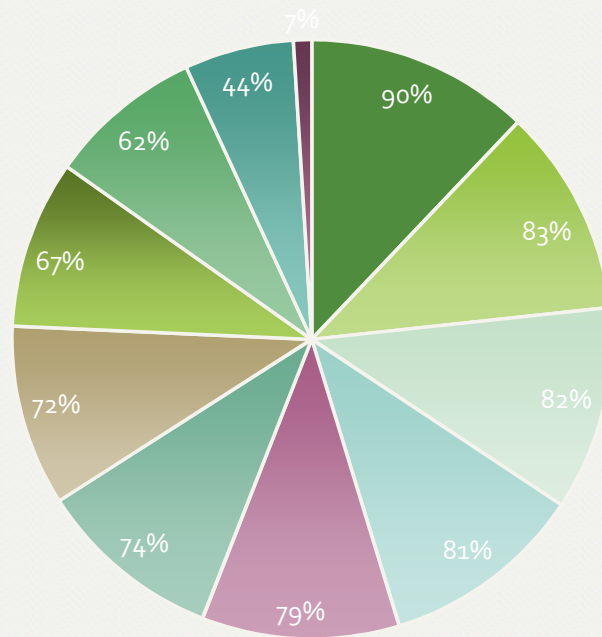

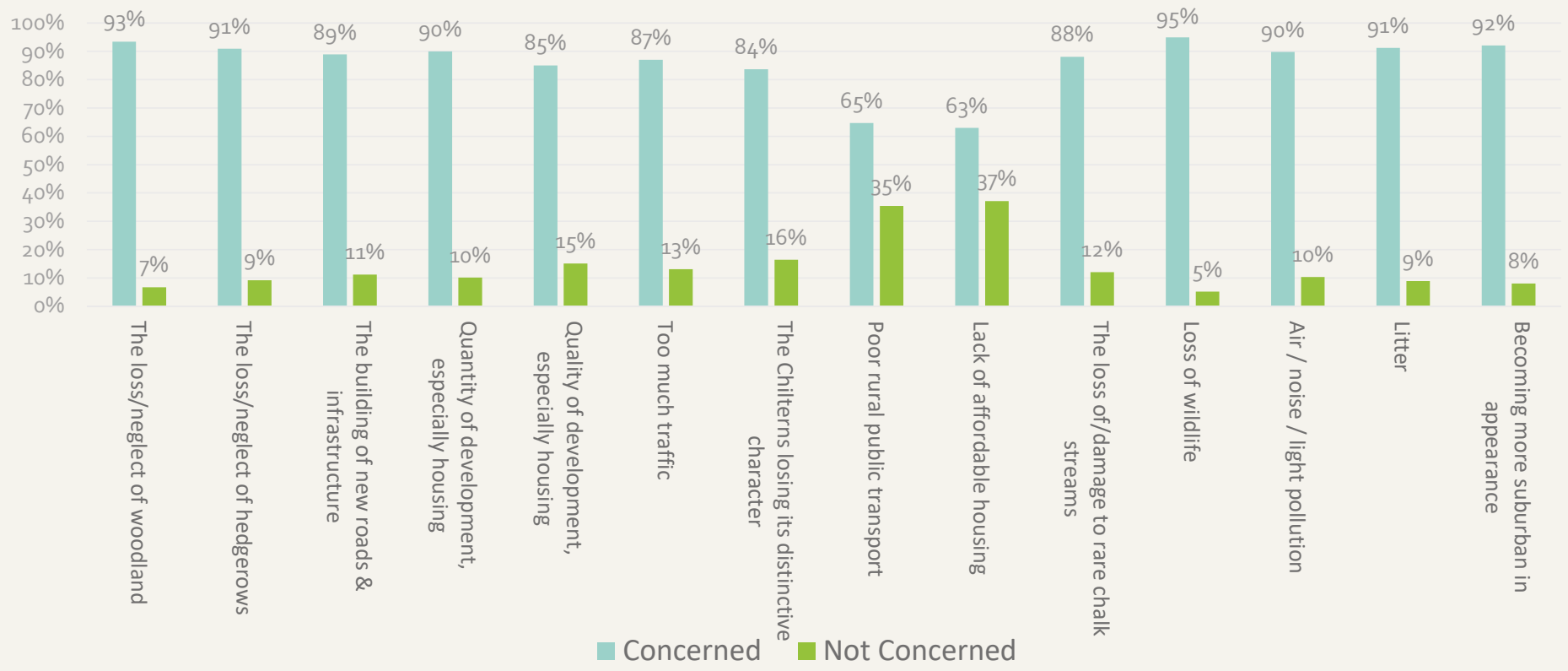


What ONE thing do you value most about the Chilterns?
