

Wendover Woods Walks

Walks likely to be suitable for people with impaired mobility and users of wheelchairs, mobility scooters and pushchairs



Wendover Woods is a large woodland with a network of trails for walking, cycling, horse riding and keep fit. The woods are the highest point in the Chilterns with good views and bluebell flowers in early May. There is car parking, toilets, children's play area and picnic areas.

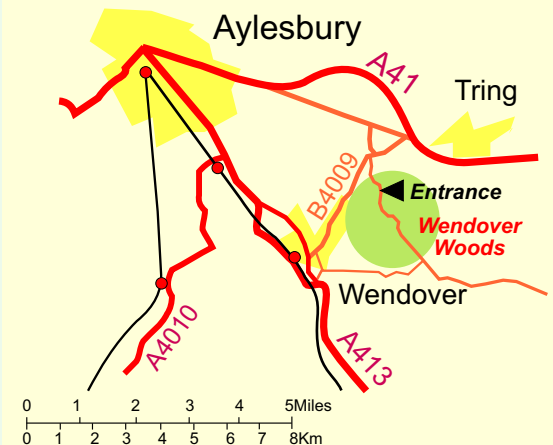
Path Information

There are many paths with hard surfaces including an All Ability Trail, however the Woods are hilly and steep slopes limit the length of trails that can be used.

There are no stiles or barriers. For those wanting to explore there are many natural "challenging" paths. The map shows types of path, slopes, etc. to help you to decide which paths are suitable for you.



How to get there



The entrance to the Woods is from a minor road off the B4009 between Wendover and the A41. The Woods are signposted. The entrance is on the right hand side as you go up Aston Hill.

Visitor Information

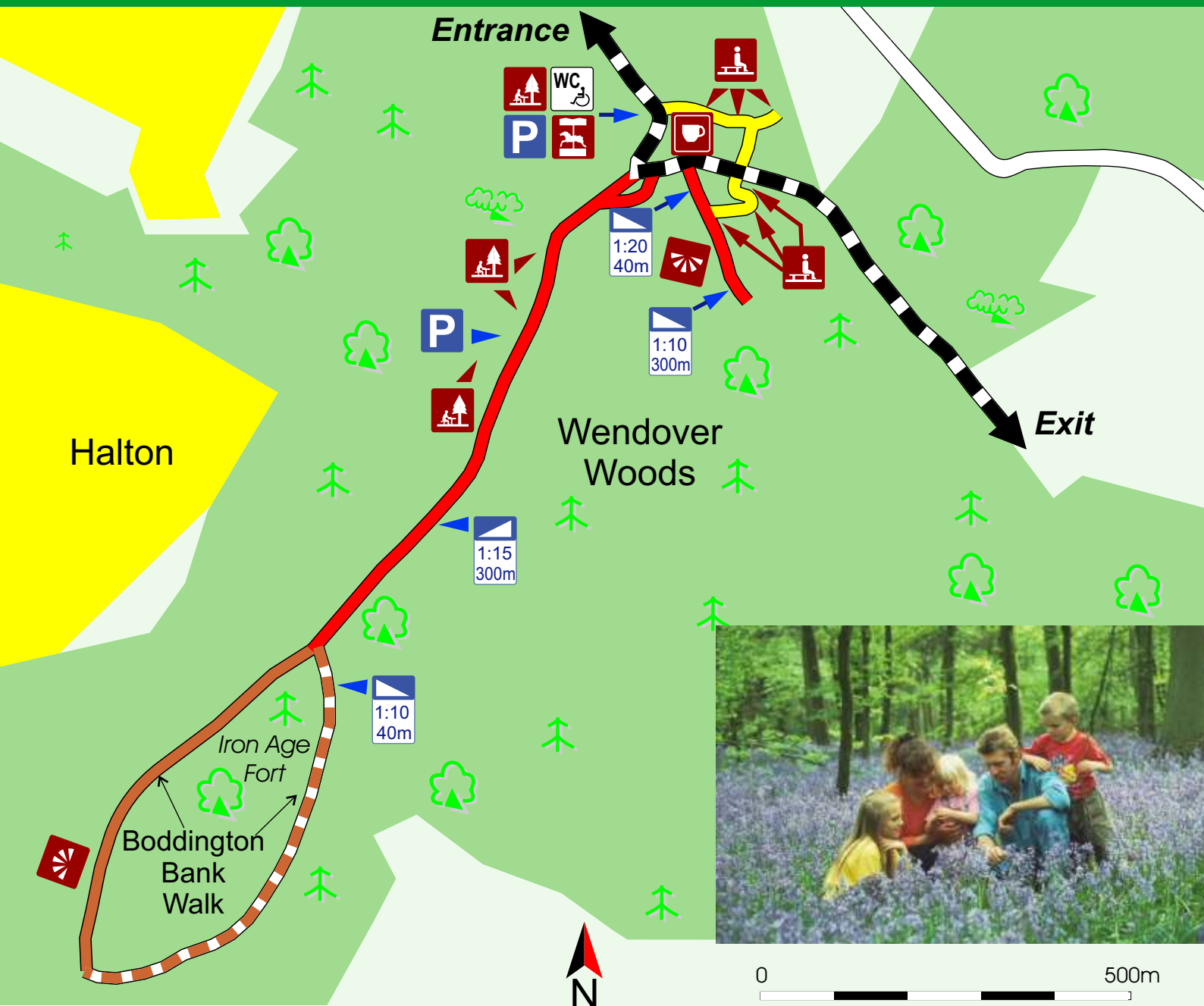
- Open from 8am until dusk.
 - Car parking is pay and display.
 - Public and disabled toilets.
 - There is a café in the woods, open 10.30am - 5pm every day (except Christmas day)
 - Dogs are welcome but must be kept under control.
 - The woods are managed by the Forestry Commission. Call 01420 520212 for more information about the woods or to report any problems.

Path surfaces

-  Tarmac road, can be used but beware of vehicles
-  All Ability Trail. Hard, mainly smooth path
-  Hard surface, bumpy & uneven with some loose stones up to 40 mm. (partially used by vehicles to reach car park)
-  Natural earth path. Firm but bumpy. Uneven with puddles/mud after rain. Some tree roots or loose stones up to 20 mm
-  Natural earth path. Firm but bumpy. Uneven with puddles/mud after rain. Many tree roots, some up to 80mm.
